Volunteer Driver / Crew

This is a volunteering position, not a contract of employment

Volunteer Hours

Flexible shifts and driving rounds, according to availability

Lunch and Breaks

As appropriate to tasks being undertaken

Primary Purpose of Role

To collect, transport and deliver food and other household essentials to and from our Food Hub.

To support the movement of material and equipment for Urban Outreach projects and events.

Role Description (Main Duties and Responsibilities)

To undertake <u>one or more</u> of the following tasks as appropriate:

- Collect donated food from supermarkets and transport to our 'Food Hub' which is located at the former
 Office Outlet retail warehouse at Trinity Retail Park, off Bradford Street BL2 1HY
- 2. Collect contents of grub-tubs from locations throughout Bolton and transport to the Food Hub.
- 3. Help deliver lunches during school holidays to schools, churches and community centres participating in the 'Bolton Lunches' project.
- 4. Maintain UOB food safety and infection control procedures at all times.
- 5. Collect 'harvest' donated food from participating churches and schools throughout Bolton, and transport to the Food Hub.
- 6. Collect food for the 'Christmas Dinner on Jesus' project as required.
- 7. Help support the delivery of food parcels to beneficiary households throughout Bolton.
- 8. Help load and transport food, furniture, materials and equipment between venues as and when required.
- 9. Collect and transport cardboard and other waste to recycling centres.
- 10. Provide information and signpost customers towards UOB staff for help and support as necessary.
- 11. During the course of your volunteering, you may be asked to support staff in maintaining basic customer records and driver records.
- 12. You will need to keep all customer information confidential to be shared only with UOB staff.

Other requirements of this role

- 13. Either have use of a suitable vehicle for your volunteering work, for which a vehicle use allowance is payable, and/or
- 14. Take responsibility for a Urban Outreach van for your volunteering duties, (drivers over the age of 25 only). Conduct visual checks on van (eg. tyre pressure, milometer, fuel etc), and keep clean and tidy.
- 15. Conduct your volunteering activities in accordance with our Risk Assessments (ie. moving and handling and driving).
- 16. Undertake appropriate training and development as necessary to meet all requirements of the role.
- 17. Investigate and deal promptly with complaints and queries from customers and partner organisations.
- 18. Conduct all tasks with full regard to all our policies, practices and procedures with particular regard to confidentiality, health & safety, equality & diversity, safeguarding and customer care.
- 19. Observe and comply with our Smoke Free Policy.
- 20. Provide support for other volunteers and staff as appropriate.

possess a high level of integrity and discretion	If you are able and sufficiently experienced to drive an Urban Outreach van, you will need to be over 25 years of age and possess a full clean driving license with the necessary permissions.
are able and willing to receive and follow instructions - working as part of a team	Volunteering Arrangements
are able to relate well to people including staff, clients and individuals from other organisations	For appointed volunteers, we will prepare a Volunteer Agreement outlining what you can expect under this arrangement.
are willing and able to attend training to refresh and develop their skills and knowledge.	Volunteering Agreements are not contracts of employment.
