Children & Families Team



52 individual children were reported missing, aged 3-17.

RUNA responded to 2185 missing child episodes. RISE Worked 1:1 with 97 young people and 32 parents.



Group provision has looked at emotions, self esteem and anxiety, wellbeing and self-care, friendship, emotional health tool kit, games, socialising and much more!

Trips and activities have included: wellbeing walks, Jump Extreme and 'pop up' cinema.

CHRISTMAS AT THE AMBER CENTRE



Our Eve's Space team have continued to work closely with many teams in Bolton including Bolton Probation, Holding Families, Achieve, Ingeus, Greater Manchester Women's Alliance and NHS Foundation Trust to provide well rounded support for our women. Christmas was a wonderful opportunity for all the workers to enjoy time together as a team, appreciate each others work and celebrate everything we accomplished in 2023.

2023 marked the first Christmas of our Genesis Project.
Genesis is providing an invaluable safe space for those in vulnerable positions; such as those moving from homelessness to housed or those overcoming addiction. Working closely with teams such as Rapid Rehousing, the rough sleeper team, Drug and Alcohol team and Early Intervention. Genesis is providing support, encouragement and most importantly friendship to those in need.

NEW AND UPCOMING OPPORTUNITIES



Flourish is a new virtual reality course created with survivors for survivors of domestic abuse. Flourish aims to teach women about the effects of coercive control, understand what happened to them and help plan for the future. The first course met in January and courses will continue throughout 2024.

Coming soon to the Amber Centre will be a small group who will begin to explore their own individual ways of being creative through different forms of art media, the written word, and any other ways of expressing unique thoughts and ideas. We are excited at this opportunity to get together to be inspirational and to get to know each other in a safe, friendly space.

We are joining forces with Christians Against Poverty to deliver two sessions on money coaching. Through expert help an a series of videos the course will cover drawing up and balancing a personal budget and managing expenditure. Designed to empower clients with the knowledge, skills, tools and confidence to better manage their finances.

STREET LIFE PROJECT

Due to the housing crises across the country, we are seeing a huge number of people coming to the Street Life Drop-in, many in desperate situations. The team aids those in need in finding suitable private rents, mediating with landlords and providing advice on tenants rights and eviction processes. Further support is offered to address the causes of homelessness such as applying for benefits, registering clients with vital health services such as GPs, mental health services, and, drug and alcohol detox/rehabilitation services.
